GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

In these General and Specific Terms and Conditions: -

- (a) "Applicant" refers to the entity or individual submitting this entry form.
 - (b) "Event" refers to the 14th Asia Pacific Orchid Conference Singapore 2023.
 - (c) "Exhibitor" refers to an Applicant whose entry has been accepted by the Show Organisers.
 - (d) "Judges" refers to the judges judging the Orchid Landscape Display Competition and/or the Orchid Plant Competition, as the case may be.
 - (e) "Landscape Display" refers to each landscape display submitted for the Orchid Landscape Display Competition.
 - (f) "Orchid Plant" refers to any plant submitted for the Orchid Plant Competition.
 - (g) "Show Organisers" refer to the National Parks Board and the Orchid Society of South East Asia.
 - (h) "Exhibit Area" refers to the relevant Exhibit Area(s) specified in the Specific Terms and Conditions for each competition.
 - (i) "Show Secretariat" refers to the relevant staff listed in the Specific Terms and Conditions.
 - (j) "Show Chair" refers to the individual supervising the Event.
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1. The Landscape Display Competition and Orchid Plant Competition will be held at the Singapore EXPO as part of the Event. The Event will be officially open to the public from Wednesday 16 August 2023 10.00 am until Sunday 20 August 2023, 9.00 pm (last entry at 8.00pm).
 2. Exhibitors may participate in the Landscape Display Competition and/or the Orchid Plant Competition in their own name, or under a pseudonym or in the name of an organisation or corporate entity. Joint participation is not allowed.
 3. For Applicants and overseas Exhibitors, information on obtaining a CITES Permit and Phytosanitary Certificate are available from the Show Secretariat and will be provided to Applicants and Exhibitors upon request.
 4. Acceptance of Landscape Displays or Orchid Plants is at the discretion of the Show Organisers at the point of set-up or delivery of plants. In the event that any Exhibitor's Landscape Display or Orchid Plant is not accepted, an appeal may be made to the Show Chair or Chair of Judges, respectively, and their decision will be final.
 5. Landscape Displays should not contain flowering plants other than orchids.
 6. Disbudded plants, diseased plants and newly collected jungle plants must not be exhibited.
 7. Watering, misting and maintenance of Orchid Plants and plant materials will be carried out by the Show Organisers. Exhibitors who wish to perform their own watering and/or implement their own maintenance schedule must obtain the prior approval of the Show Organisers and inform the Show Organisers of the maintenance schedule.
 8. Stakes or wires must be unobtrusive and must not touch any part of any flower, including the pedicel. Such stakes or wires must also not extend beyond the first flower, except in the case of Phalaenopsis and Oncidium Alliance exhibits.
 9. The Show Organisers may remove or request the Exhibitors to replace plant materials that are withered or diseased and unsuitable for display. Exhibitors whose Orchid Plants or materials are removed from the Landscape Display by the organisers will be notified to collect their plants from the show site.
 10. No Landscape Displays or Orchid Plants or materials are to be removed (save where the Orchids or materials used need to be refreshed) before the tear down date without the permission of the Show Manager.

11. Landscape Displays, Orchid Plants and materials may be retrieved after the close of the Event on Sunday, 20 August 2023, from 9.00 pm onwards up to 10.00pm or the following day Monday, 21 August 2023 from 8.30 am onwards up to 7.00 pm.
12. Judges will be invited to preside over the Landscape Display Competition and Orchid Plant Competition. Overseas exhibitors are encouraged to submit their orchid plants for competition. Where it is not possible to send an orchid plant, cut flowers may be submitted but the cut flowers will not complete in the respective sections of the Orchid Plant Competition. However Judges may, at their sole discretion, recommend a special award for outstanding cut flowers.
13. The Awards Committee of the Orchid Society of South East Asia (OSSEA) will consider recommending worthy exhibits for quality awards (FCC, AM, ABM, HCC, CCM/OSSEA) but these Awards will be subject to confirmation by the General Committee of OSSEA. Entrance Fee for Judging will be waived. There is a fee of S\$ 50 for an Award Certificate.
14. Prizes:
 - (a) Prizes include APOC Show Trophies, Rosettes and medals, the details of which are as set out in the Schedule.
 - (b) Generally:
 - (i) Rosettes: Rosettes are awarded to an Orchid Plant or a Landscape Display (as the case may be) within a class of each section. There shall be three Rosette winners in each class, demarcating the first place winner, the second place winner and the third place winner.
 - (ii) APOC Show Trophy: APOC Show Trophy may be awarded at the Judges' discretion to the best exhibits among the Rosette winners within each section in the Landscape Display Competition and/or Orchid Plant Competition.
 - (c) The Judges retain the sole discretion to determine whether any prizes are to be awarded for each Landscape Display or Orchid Plant, including determining whether more than one type or category of prize should be awarded for each Landscape Display or Orchid Plant.
15. The Judges will evaluate the merit of the exhibits, and their decisions shall be final. They may, in their absolute discretion, declare any entry for the Landscape Display Competition or the Orchid Plant Competition void, or, if they should consider that there are no entries reaching the required standard, they may withhold prizes as they think fit.
16. Any breach of the General and Specific Terms and Conditions may lead to the disqualification of the Exhibitor concerned. Any appeal concerning such disqualification, or any other matter must be made to the Show, whose decision shall be final.
17. The Exhibitor shall be responsible for all property (whether belonging to the Exhibitor, his employee, agent or contractor) placed, deposited, brought into or left in the Exhibit Area. The Show Organisers shall not be liable in respect of any loss or damage to the Exhibitor's Landscape Display, Orchid Plants, Exhibits, belongings and other items.
18. Upon the conclusion of the Event, the Exhibitor shall dismantle or remove all property brought into the Exhibit Area and ensure that all litter and debris are disposed of by Monday, 21 August 2023, 7.00pm. Any property, litter, debris or rubbish remaining in the Exhibit Area after such time may be disposed of by the Show Organisers in any manner and at the Show Organisers' discretion. The Show Organisers shall not be liable to the Exhibitor for any loss, cost, expense, damage or other consequences arising from such disposal. The Exhibitor shall reimburse the Show Organisers for any cost and expense incurred by the Show Organisers from such disposal.

1. Applicants shall submit the attached entry form together with a design sketch of the Landscape Display for shortlisting by the Show Organisers. All entry forms must be complete with full details. Incomplete forms (including those with insufficient details or incomplete documents) will be rejected. The closing date for submission is Tuesday, 16 May 2023. Shortlisted Applicants will be notified within 2 weeks from the closing date.
2. Shortlisted Applicants who are selected to be Exhibitors will be provided with the following materials:
 - Foliage plants including small trees, shrubs and ground cover
 - Saw dust/wood shaving
 - Sand (or equivalent)
 - Tree branches (only provided upon request, subject to availability)
 - 4 x spotlights for 10 sqm and 6 x spotlights for 15 sqm
 - 2 x 13-amp power point for each landscape exhibit
 - A3 signboard to indicate name of Exhibitor
3. For other requests for material provision or assistance pertaining to the set-up of the Landscape Display, Exhibitors may contact the Show Secretariat, who will assess the requests and try to facilitate on a case-by-case basis. Such requests should be made with ample lead time.
4. Whilst copyright in the design of the Landscape Display remains with the Exhibitor, the Exhibitor grants the Show Organisers the right to reproduce the Landscape Display without the prior approval of the Exhibitor. However, in such event, the Show Organisers will acknowledge the Exhibitor as the designer of the Landscape Display.
5. Exhibitors shall ensure that the set-up of their Landscape Display shall be completed within the allocated set-up period.

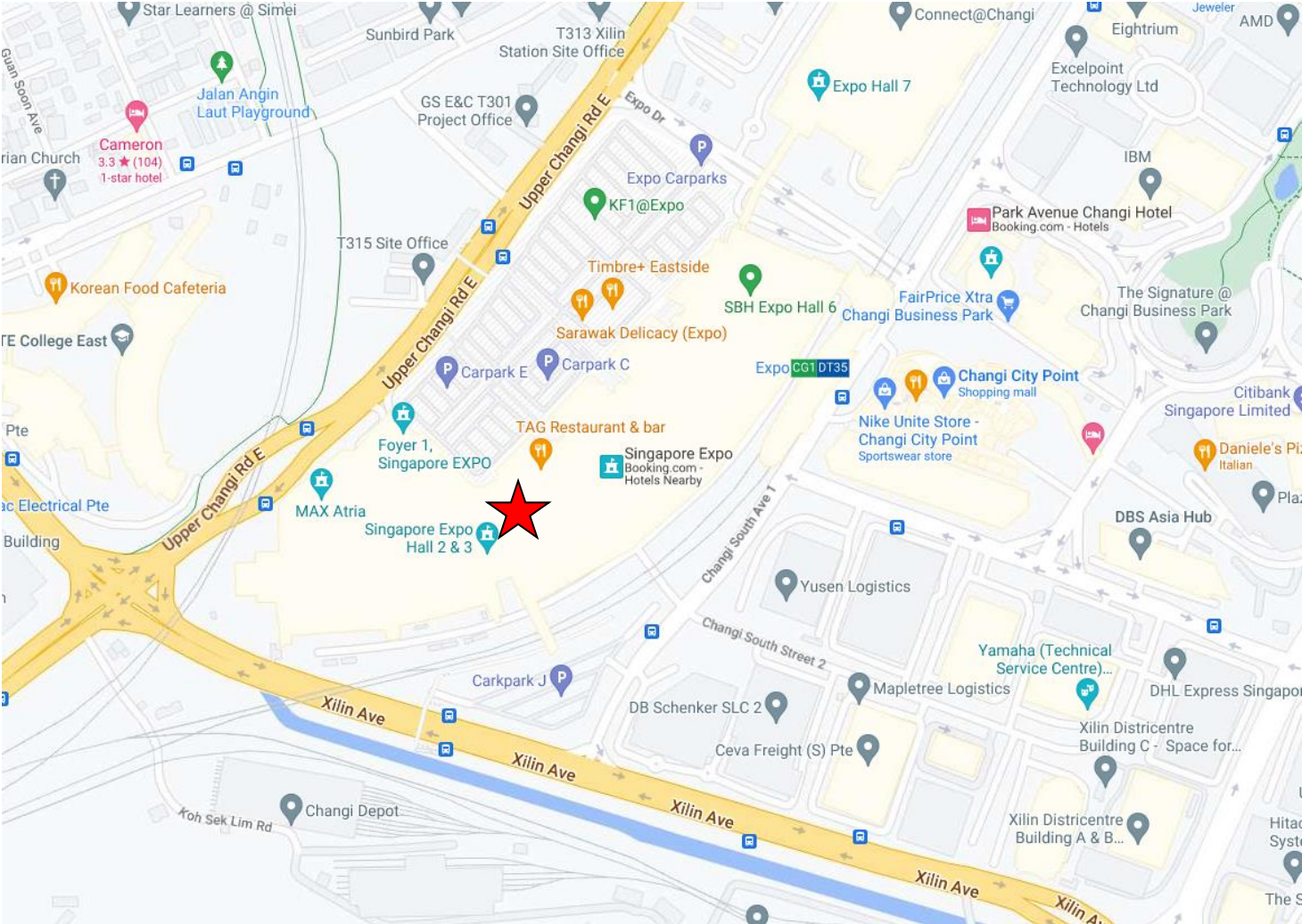

1. Exhibitors for the Orchid Plant Competition will be required to complete an online registration via a link to be made available at the Orchid Society of South East Asia's website. Any Exhibitor may contact the Show Secretariat for details of how to register plants online. Exhibitors may contact the Show Secretariat if they encounter issues with online registration.
2. Exhibitors who have registered online will be scheduled to deliver their Orchid Plants during the registration period.
3. Acceptance of Orchid Plants after 14 August 2023, 4pm is at the discretion of the Show Manager.
4. It is important that Exhibitors correctly identify and label their Orchid Plants before delivery at the Exhibit Area, to avoid delays. Upon delivery at the Exhibit Area, Orchid Plants will be labelled with official show labels.
5. Orchids with attractive or variegated foliage will be judged as foliage plants (under Section 17 of the Schedule). Where the Orchid Plants are flowering, they will also be considered in the respective floral classes listed in the Schedule. The Chair of Judges has the discretion to determine the appropriate class of a particular Orchid Plant.
6. Where more than one Orchid Plant is in a pot or other container or mount, only the Plant in the best condition will be considered. In the case of Papilionanthe and near terete Papilionandas, up to 5 plants (stems) may be included in the pot and will be judged as a group. Please refer to further details in Section 4 of the Schedule.

7. Exhibitors are not allowed to enter the individual competition area to place their plants. Such placement of the registered plants in sections and classes within the individual competition area will be carried out by stewards assisting the Judges. Plants in Landscape Displays will not be judged under the Orchid Plant Competition.
8. The following is a list of special awards which Exhibitors may win: -

- (i) APOC Show Trophy for the Grand Champion plant
 - (ii) APOC Show Trophy for the Best Specimen Plant
 - (iii) APOC Show Trophy for the Best Species

9. To be eligible for Rosettes, Trophies, or Medals, hybrid orchids must be entered under the Royal Horticultural Society's ("RHS") registered name or parentage. If there is no registered name with the RHS, the parentage must be provided. Orchid Plants exhibited under Trade Names will not be eligible for rosettes, medals and trophies and may only be exhibited non-competitively.
 10. Rosettes are awarded for first, second and third placing within each class of each section.

4. Vanda hybrids predominantly blue or purple

SECTION 3	Strap-leaf Vanda Species and Hybrids – small flowered: Flowers below 6 cm high or wide.
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Includes all small flowered genera registered as Vanda as of January 2013 (e.g. Ascocentrum, small Ascocendas, Neofinetia).

SECTION 4	Papilionanthe Species and Hybrids, and Papilionanda
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Includes all former terete and semi- or part-terete Vandas. For Classes 11 & 12, up to five plants (stems) may be included per pot and will be judged as a collection. If more than five stems are included, only the best single stem will be considered.

Medal for the best Papilionanthe and Papilionanda (Classes 11-15)

12. Papilionanda hybrids, semi-terete with strong Papilionanthe influence, e.g. Pda Rubella

SECTION 5	Arachnis, Renanthera and Allied Hybrids including Aranda

Includes all species now registered as Phalaenopsis as of January 2013 (e.g. Kingidium, Doritis)

Medal for the best Phalaenopsis species (Classes 25-28)

25. Phalaenopsis bellina and Phalaenopsis violacea
26. Phalaenopsis cornu-cervi and other species in sect. Polychilos (e.g. pantherina, mannii, borneënsis)
27. Phalaenopsis amabilis and other species in sect. Phalaenopsis (e.g. schilleriana, sanderiana, aphrodite)
28. Phalaenopsis – any other species

SECTION 7**Phalaenopsis Hybrids and Phal pulcherrima**

Medal for the best Phalaenopsis and Phal pulcherrima hybrids (Classes 29-44)

Class

29. Phalaenopsis hybrids – cornu-cervi and related hybrids, derived from Phal cornu-cervi, borneënsis, lamilligera, mannii or pantherina. E.g. Phal Valentini, Ipoh Red Gem, Su-An Cricket, Corona.
30. Phalaenopsis hybrids - star shaped (any colour, without distinctive markings, and excluding hybrids covered under Section 31). E.g. Phal LD's Bear Queen, Samera, Penang Viola.
31. Phalaenopsis hybrids - star shaped (any colour, with markings, bars or blotches, and excluding hybrids covered under Section 30). E.g. Phal KS Super Zebra, Brother Ambo Passion, Yaphon Sir.
32. Phalaenopsis hybrids – standard white (not being Star Shaped, with flowers 8 cm or more across on branching or non-branching inflorescences).
33. Phalaenopsis hybrids – standard white with coloured lip
34. Phalaenopsis hybrids – standard – pink, purple or violet with or without markings
35. Phalaenopsis hybrids – standard – stripes, splash
36. Phalaenopsis hybrids – standard – any other colour or markings
37. Phalaenopsis hybrids, small – white (may include with coloured lip or markings)
“small” Phalaenopsis hybrids are those, not being Star Shaped, but with flowers less than 8 cm across on branching or non-branching inflorescences; usually with Phal. equestris influence.
38. Phalaenopsis hybrids, small – harlequin blotches (any colour)
39. Phalaenopsis hybrids, small – stripes, splash,
40. Phalaenopsis hybrids, small – pink, purple or violet with or without marking
41. Phalaenopsis hybrids, other – any other colour with or without markings
42. Phalaenopsis pulcherrima or hybrids with predominantly Phal pulcherrima influence and characteristics, e.g., erect inflorescence.
43. Phalaenopsis any other hybrid not included above and any intergeneric or multigeneris phalaenopsis type hybrids
44. Miniature Phalaenopsis – plant and inflorescence under 15cm high

SECTION 8	Vandaeae – Other Species and Hybrids
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Medal for the best Paraphalaenopsis, Aerides or other vandaceous (Classes 45-48)

45. Paraphalaenopsis species and intra- or intergeneric hybrids with predominantly Paraphalaenopsis influence and characteristics (e.g. Sealara Nelson Mandela)
